Marianne A. Rebisz, 82, of Rebisz Road, Broadalbin passed away Sunday morning September 13, 2020 at Wilkinson RHCF, Amsterdam.

She was born in Kattowitz, Poland on January 20, 1938 a daughter of the late Stefan and Charlotte Mendetzki Adamoschek and came to the United States in 1951, settling in Galway. Marianne was a 1958 graduate of Galway High School. She moved to Broadalbin in 1959 after her marriage.

Marianne was a loving mother and devoted housewife. Her greatest joy was raising her three sons and watching them raise their families on Rebisz Road. She was a wonderful cook, always making enough for an army, and her sewing talents were endless. She taught unconditional love and the value of family.
