



Burlin C. Argotsinger

October 3, 1923 - August 8, 2023

Burlin C. Argotsinger, 99, formerly of Mayfield, passed away on Tuesday, August 8, 2023.

He was born on the family farm in the Town of Mayfield and lived most of his life on the Argotsinger farm which was established in 1852. Burlin attended school in Broadalbin.

Mr. Argotsinger owned and operated the Argland Dairy Farm, along with his wife, Thelma, for thirty-eight years.

Burlin was a lifelong and devoted member of the First Presbyterian Church in Broadalbin. He served many terms on various church committees and rarely missed a service.

Mr. Argotsinger was a fifty-year member of the Holstein Friesian Association and served several terms on the Government Agriculture Stabilization committee. He was a director and officer of the Farm Bureau of Fulton County, and an agent and former director of the Fulton County Insurance Association. Burlin served on the Fulton County Eastern Breeder Board as a delegate for many years and was a former chairman of the Fulton County Agriculture and Farmland Protection Board. He also served on the Board of Directors of Fulton and Montgomery County Extension. Burlin was involved with the Fulton County Community Heritage Corporation for several years and was a member of the Broadalbin-Mayfield Rural Cemetery Association. He was deeply devoted to farming and his animals and won several awards over the years. Burlin was predeceased by his wife of forty-eight years, Thelma Frasier

Argotsinger; a son Gary Argotsinger; his wife, Lillian Whipple Argotsinger; three sisters, Edna (Dick) Tryanna and Marion and Thelma Argotsinger; and two brothers, Crawford and Clinton Argotsinger.

Survivors include a son, William (Cherie) Argotsinger of Halfmoon; five stepchildren, Larry Theurer of Hatfield, PA, Walter Theurer and Rebecca (John) Bacon all of Gloversville, and Kathie (Chris) Rohrs and Elaine Warner all of Johnstown; several grandchildren, nieces, nephews, and cousins.
