Carl E. Neahr, 87, of State Route 29, entered eternal life on Monday, January 15, 2018, at St. Mary's Healthcare, Amsterdam surrounded by his dedicated and loving family.

He was born in the Town of Providence on April 27, 1930, a son of Howard and Anna Stanton Neahr, and was educated in local schools. Carl was a lifelong area resident, well-known and loved by many.

Mr. Neahr was a road construction foreman and was a member of the Labor Union Local #186, based in Plattsburgh. He retired in 1993.

Carl was a very proud veteran of the US Army and served during the Korean War. He was the recipient of the Purple Heart and also the Korean Service Medal with three bronze service stars.

Mr. Neahr was a life member of the Galway Volunteer Fire Department, and a life member of the VFW and American Legion, both in Broadalbin. He was also a life member of the Galway Fish & Game Club, serving as president for thirteen years, instrumental in securing property and building the clubhouse at the present site.

He was married to Doris Hicks Neahr on April 5, 1953, to whom he was completely dedicated for 61 years. She passed away on his birthday, April 27, 2014. He was also predeceased by his siblings, Homer Neahr and Louise Sherman.

Left to cherish his memory includes a son, Carl H. Neahr of Hagaman; three daughters, Sandra (Jeff) Hovey of Glenville, Lois (Del) Armer of Galway, and
