Carol Jean Gasner Kosinski, 78, formerly of Broadalbin, passed away on Tuesday December 10, 2019 at Mesilla Valley Hospice, Las Cruces, NM. She was born in Amsterdam, NY on September 17, 1941 a daughter of Clayton and Jane Glamm Gasner and was a 1959 graduate of Broadalbin High School. In 1963, she graduated from Albany College of Pharmacy. Carol lived in Broadalbin for sixty years before moving to Las Cruces in 2001.

Mrs. Kosinski was a pharmacist for forty years and co-owned and –operated the Broadalbin Pharmacy, with her late husband, Ron. Together, they also owned and operated Eagle Mills Cider Mill, Meadowlark Blueberry Farm, and Rolling Ridge Mobile Home Park, all in Broadalbin.

She married Ronald Kosinski on July 31, 1970. He died April 28, 1999. In addition to her husband and parents, she was predeceased by a brother, Leonard Gasner and a sister, Nancy Whitman.

Survivors include a brother, William (Patricia) Gasner; three sisters, Patricia (Ronald) Smith, Judith (Gerald) Flynn, and Pamela (Charles) Marchese; a sister-in-law, Cheryl Gasner; a brother-in-law, Gene Whitman; and several nieces, nephews, great-nieces and –nephews, and a great-great-nephew.
