Daniel W. Hayes, 69, of Stevers Mill Road, Broadalbin, passed away Thursday morning, July 15, 2021, at Albany Medical Center surrounded by his loving family.

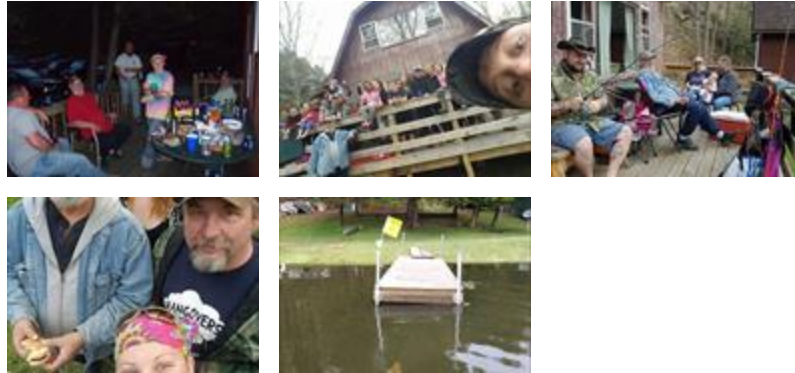
