Doris M. Deuel, 93, of North Street, Broadalbin died Sunday afternoon January 12, 2020 at St. Mary's Healthcare.

She was born in Broadalbin on April 30, 1926 a daughter of Raymond and Elsie Carr Mosher and was a 1944 graduate of Perth Central School. Doris was a lifelong area resident.

When she was a teenager, Doris along with her twin sister, Dorothy, sang as a duet known as the Mosher Twins, every Saturday morning on WGY Radio. They also sang at various area churches.

At one time, Mrs. Deuel was employed at the former Chalmers Mills in Amsterdam. Later, she served children with disabilities at BOCES until she had a stroke in her early 50s.

Doris was a member of the Broadalbin Baptist Church. She was an avid gardener and enjoyed landscaping her property. She also enjoyed oil painting. Mostly, Doris loved serving her church. She was known for her skills in organizing church dinners. Her greatest joy was teaching young children in the AWANA program at church.

In addition to her parents, she was predeceased by three sisters, Alice Decker, Evelyn Lilley, and Dorothy Grant; and three brothers-in-law, George Decker, George Lilley, and Collin Grant.

Survivors include her husband, Roger Warren Deuel, whom she married on June 28, 1945; a son, David C. (Nancy) Deuel of Broadalbin; four grandchildren, Rebekah H. Jones (Rodney), Joanna R. Deuel, Michael C.

Deuel (Caitlyn), and Joshua D. Deuel; three great-granddaughters, Emeline, Edythe, and Elenora Jones; and several nieces, nephews, and cousins.
