James H. Hemstreet, 82, of State Highway 29, Johnstown, passed away Monday, January 12, 2026, at Mountain Valley Hospice in Gloversville. Born at home in the town of Perth on April 12, 1943, a son of Walter and Kathryn Brownell Hemstreet, he attended school in Perth and was a lifelong resident of Fulton County.

Jim was a well-respected farrier in the capital district for 52 years, retiring in 2019. He also held a CDL license and worked for several local businesses. Jim enjoyed creating custom leatherwork. His entry of a saddle and breast collar was awarded Best in Show at the 2024 Fonda Fair. Jim liked camping and trail riding with family and friends. He went on many horse and mule packing trips, serving as the camp cook.

Jim was a member, past president, and served as vice president of the Eastern Regional Draft Horse Association.

He was a member of the US Army and served in Vietnam.

In addition to his parents, Jim was predeceased by a brother, Robert and a sister, Eleanor (Dan).

Survivors include his wife, Barbara Campchero Hemstreet, whom he married on May 31, 1975; four children, Pamela, Marcia (Bruce), Sandra (Justin), and Kathryn; two brothers, John (Sally) and Harvey (Donna); two sisters, Joan (David) and Mary Lou (Jerry); sister-in-law Julie; grandsons, Paul and Patrick; brother-in-law, Bob (Cathleen); two sisters-in-law, Nancy and Beth (Fred); Godson, Rob; Goddaughter Kathy, and numerous caring nieces, nephews,

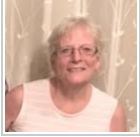

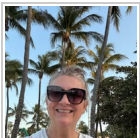
