Broadalbin – Pastor John E. Crabbe, 87, of Broadalbin, passed away Wednesday morning, April 7, 2021 at St. Mary's Healthcare in Amsterdam.

Born in Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada on October 25, 1933, he was the son of the late Stanley Crabbe and Lillian Rozee Crabbe. John was raised and educated in Canada and earned his bachelor's degree from Tennessee Temple University.

John first and foremost was a faithful servant of his beloved Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. He was a loving husband, caring father, and dedicated friend to all he met. He spent all his years pouring himself into others as Pastor, Evangelist, and supporter of missionaries around the world. John was always ready with an encouraging word, heartfelt prayer, and whatever he had in his wallet.

In September of 1958, John married the former Jennie Shaheen. Sadly, she died June 22, 1985. In addition to his parents and wife, he was predeceased by two grandsons, Tyler and Cameron Lindsay; and his siblings, Edna Macintosh and Ronald Crabbe.

Survivors include his children, Valerie (Curtis) Lindsay of Cypress, TX and

John (Nicola West) Crabbe of Littleton, CO; two grandchildren, Sofie Crabbe and Carsen Lindsay; his dear friend, Brenda Leslie of Broadalbin; a nephew, Kevin Macintosh; and a niece, Karla Portengen.

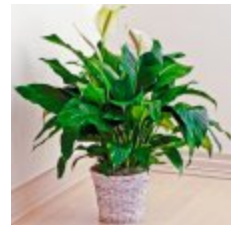
