March 21, 1957 - January 27, 2022

Joseph M. Adamkoski, Sr., 64, of Gloversville, went home to be with the Lord from Albany Medical Center on Thursday, January 27, 2022, after a brief illness.

He was born in Amsterdam on March 21, 1957, the youngest of seven children to the late Walter and Gertrude Destocki Adamkoski.

At a very young age, Joe trusted the Lord Jesus Christ as his personal Savior. His love and devotion to the Lord inspired him to assist in founding churches and supporting missionaries, pastors, and children's ministries. Whenever a need arose in the Lord's work, Joe was always there to provide support so that others could hear the Gospel. He remained faithful to the Lord and finished his course well.

As a second-generation house mover, Joe started his own business specializing in lifting and moving buildings. He took the knowledge and experience gained from his father and continued to implement innovative ideas to accomplish difficult projects. To undertake these jobs, he acquired modern equipment, including a Unified Hydraulic Jacking System, the only one of its kind in the surrounding area. As a longtime member of the International Association of Structural Movers, he was always looking for ways to improve his craft. It wasn't just work to him; Joe truly loved what he did.

Joe loved his family and always looked forward to birthdays and holiday gatherings. He enjoyed attending auctions and talking with friends. He especially loved spending time with his grandchildren and was often seen giving them golf cart rides, running heavy equipment with them, and taking them out to breakfast. He was their Papa and shared a special bond with them that words cannot describe. Joe will be greatly missed by all.
