With unimaginable sorrow, we announce after a 6 month fight with brain cancer, on April 25th, 2023, Julia M. Fisk passed away peacefully in Saratoga Springs, NY surrounded by Peter, Gretchen, Hannah, and Ian.

Born in Memphis, Tennessee, Julia went on to live in Missouri, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Ohio, Texas, Arkansas, and Iowa. From a young age, it was clear that Julia was an artist. She went on to graduate from the University of South Florida with a Bachelors degree in Art Education and further obtained her Masters in Early Childhood Education from Kent State University. It was in Tampa where Julia met the love of her life, Peter Thomas, while they were both working at Busch Gardens. They were immediately inseparable and linked forever because to know Julia is to love her.

After marrying in June 1987, Julia and Peter continued their adventure around the country together. They welcomed daughters Gretchen Taylor in Tampa, Florida and Hannah Lou in Garrettsville, Ohio. And, then their son, Ian Thomas, in Langhorne, Pennsylvania.

Julia touched countless lives throughout her nearly 30 years of teaching. She was a devoted teacher at Blanton Elementary and Sawgrass Elementary in St. Petersburg, Florida, Whispering Oak Elementary in Winter Garden,

Florida, Johnstown elementary schools and most recently, Lynch Learning Academy in Amsterdam, New York. Julia, who signed her emails “artfully yours,” loved teaching students about the artwork of Vincent Van Gogh, Keith Haring, Mary Blair, Gustav Klimt, Wassily Kandinsky, and Yayoi Kusama.

The simplest pleasures in life brought great joy to Julia. She somehow mastered everything she did from baking the perfect biscuits to sewing beautiful gifts for family and friends to creating the loveliest flower gardens. Julia enjoyed a cozy evening with Ian (and the cats) on the sofa enjoying an elaborate home cooked meal. She loved traveling to art museums from The Clark to the Louvre and attending concerts with Gretchen and Hannah.

Julia’s memory will live on through her family, friends, and students. There was nothing in the world more important to Julia than her family and nothing will ever come close to replacing the void she leaves.

To honor Julia’s memory, we are holding a celebration of her life on May 6th, 2023, with calling hours from 11:30am - 1:30pm at the Robert M. Halgas Funeral Home, Inc., 111 County Highway 106 (corner of Route 29 & Black Street), Johnstown, NY. We invite anyone who knew and loved Julia to attend and remember her wonderful life. “*My Aunt Julia, while often hundreds of miles away, touched my life as far back as some of my earliest memories.*

She existed as an integral part of my household dynamics. As children, my siblings and I knew the odds of Julia on the other side of the ringing landline as we scrambled to get to the phone first. She could guess which little voice had answered with devilish accuracy, sending us into fits. We'd run through the house - sometimes around the yard to bring Aunt Julie to Jack and as we did, she'd chat with us as if we were friends - not a five year old playing messenger for Mom. Who could blame us for incessantly pestering the girls as they chatted. My two most favorite women in the world right in one spot.

This went on my entire life. Julia talked with my mother often, and often at length. For decades she joined us for coffee in the kitchen, afternoons on the porch, and dinners around the table.

Often only having her voice, I clung to her packages and birthday cards like gold and they may as well have been. Well into adulthood, the sheer joy and surprise of receiving a card or package in the mail from Julia has remained unparalleled. Each one, a special treat, a collage of happiness - often with every available inch of envelope laden with glittery stickers of butterflies and kittens. To this day, no one has ever written my name more beautifully than Julia Fisk, not even myself.

Among her many virtues, my aunt had an uncanny ability to show love.

She taught love as she brought love.

Julia gave to me new ways to love by showing me said love first hand. She doused the people in her life with love in dazzling color and display. She was an inviting and warm woman. Her presence filled the room like perfume.

On the rare occasion of a visit, many summers ago, Julia sat on the front porch coloring in pencils. She'd chosen a unicorn from the coloring book. It was a perfect choice for her. Since that day her unicorn has been proudly displayed on the wall of our kitchen, right next to a long-standing headshot of a young Tom Cruise and a few prophetic quotes from my sister. I look up at it every day as I have

for years now, thinking of her. Signed 'Sissy' as she did for every card sent to my mother.

My Aunt Julie will never leave my mind nor my heart, as she never has before. She comes to mind every time I see glitter and sparkly eyeshadow. Every time my mother or I utter a thoughtful, "Hmm," there the memory of her is. The cards and letters I send my loved ones are each modeled after her own. I remember her in every blooming flower I see. The love I have for Julia has always existed, and it always will.

She taught love as she brought love. I get to be reminded of her as I move through life, loving myself and those around me.

I miss her deeply. I miss her voice. I know she is in the beauty all around us, though.

I promise we will all take care of each other.

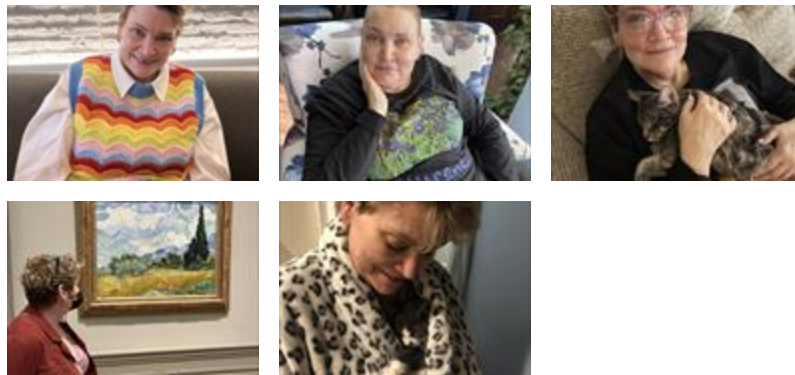
