Karen L. Fuelleman, 78, formerly of South Second Avenue, Broadalbin passed away Friday afternoon October 26, 2018 at Nathan Littauer Nursing Home, Gloversville.

She was born in Amsterdam on February 27, 1940 a daughter of the late Kenneth and Marian Seward Fuelleman and attended school in Broadalbin. Karen lived in Gloversville for several years before returning to Broadalbin in 2002.

She was employed as a press operator at the former Decca Records in Gloversville for thirty seven years, retiring in 2005.

Karen was of the Protestant faith.

She was a member of the American Legion Post #337 Auxiliary and the VFW Post #8690 Auxiliary, both in Broadalbin, a volunteer for the Make-a-Wish Foundation and the Hometown Soldier Fund, and also delivered Meals on Wheels locally for several years.

Survivors include two brothers, Kenneth (Karen) Fuelleman of Mayfield and Michael (Wendy) Fuelleman of Lexington, SC; a sister, Luanne Baird of Wilmington, DE; and several nieces, nephews, and cousins.

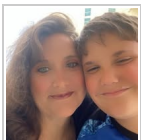
