



Raymond G. Rulison Sr.

April 6, 1934 - May 17, 2014

Raymond G. Rulison, Sr., 80, of Jockeyville Road Gloversville died at home on Saturday evening May 17, 2014 with his loving family at his side.

He was born in Johnstown on April 6, 1934 a son of Floyd and Ethel Ellsworth Rulison and was educated in local schools.

Ray entered the US Army in 1953 and proudly served during the Korean Conflict. After his discharge, he served with the National Guard in Pittsburg, returning to Johnstown in 1957. Ray later moved to Bradenton, Florida for fifteen years and returned to Gloversville in 2007. Mr. Rulison was employed as a leather worker for several local mills, including his family's, the Rulison Leather Mill in Johnstown and retired in the late 1980's.

Ray was a member of the American Legion, a former member of the Moose Club, and a member of the Eagle's Club in Florida. He enjoyed bowling and was a member of several area leagues. Ray also loved traveling, fishing, and hiking. His greatest joy was spending time with family and friends, especially his grandchildren.

In addition to his parents, he was predeceased by brothers, Clark Ellsworth, Warren, Floyd, and Maurice Rulison. Survivors include his wife, Audrey B. Undercoffer, whom he married on December 12, 1953; two sons, Raymond
