



Robert D. Montenaro

July 20, 1920 - April 10, 2020

Robert D. Montenaro, Sr., 99, of Merriam Road, Broadalbin passed away on Friday April 10, 2020 at the Wilkinson RHCF, Amsterdam.

He was born in Schenectady on July 20, 1920 a son of Peter and Rose Cafarelli Montenaro and graduated in 1938 from St. Joseph's Academy as salutatorian. Bob moved to Amsterdam in 1946 and lived in Broadalbin since 1970.

Mr. Montenaro was associated with the family business, Peter Montenaro Co., from 1938 – 1970 and later established The Synthetic Co. that he owned with his sons. Bob managed the Feather Duster Corp until retiring in 1991.

He was a veteran of the US Air Force and proudly served in the Pacific Theatre during World War II.

Mr. Montenaro was a devoted member of St. Joseph's Church in Broadalbin. He served as a trustee for over twenty years, and was an altar server, usher, lector, Eucharistic minister, and a member of the Bereavement Committee.

Bob was a charter member of the Knights of Columbus Council 7629 and a member of the 4th Degree Rev. Peter Smith Assembly.

He was an active member of the Amsterdam Lions Club since 1960 and served as president and later as secretary/treasurer for over twenty years.

Bob also served as district governor at one time. He was recently recognized for having perfect meeting attendance for sixty years.

Bob was a member of the Sacandaga Boating Club since 1962 and was a past commodore and treasurer, a member of VFW Post 8690, a member of

the American Legion Post #337, and a member of the Tribes Hill Iroquois and Broadalbin Senior Citizens.

He enjoyed fishing, hunting, and boating. He was an avid bowler and belonged to several leagues. Bob also enjoyed the CB radio as Mr. Bear, was involved with the emergency React channel and the annual Halloween Pumpkin Patrol.

He married Clara Cordes on December 23, 1943. She died May 31, 1991. He married Carmella Greco on January 2, 1995. She died June 11, 2008. In addition, he was predeceased by his siblings, Rosemary, Leo, and Peter. Survivors include his loving children, Robert (Judy) Montenaro, Jr., Diane Wadsworth, and David (Chris) Montenaro; six grandchildren; four great-grandchildren; and the Greco family.

Due to the current health situation, private services will be held for the family. Burial will be in St. Mary's Cemetery, Amsterdam. A memorial mass will be held at a later date.
