Ruth “Meme” Frasier, 82, of Reidel Road, Perth, passed away peacefully on Tuesday January 12, 2021 at her son and daughter-in-law’s home in the Town of Hope, with her loving family at her bedside.

She was born in Gloversville on February 18, 1938 the daughter of Alexander and Marie Moser Aesch and was a graduate of Mayfield Central School.

Mrs. Frasier was known as one of “the Lunch Ladies “at Perth Central School for many years, always making sure each student who wanted a lunch received one. Later, she was employed as an account clerk with the Fulton County Building & Grounds Dept. in Johnstown, until her retirement.

Ruth was a member of the North Main Methodist Church in Gloversville.

She also enjoyed cooking, gardening, and canning. She also enjoyed Bingo, visiting casinos, and traveling with her family and friends. The trip that she treasured the most was with her grandson, Jason and his wife, Kristin, when they traveled to Switzerland where her parents were born and raised. She was amazed by the beauty of the Swiss Alps and enjoyed her visit to the family ostrich farm and spending time with her “Swiss family”. Her greatest enjoyment, however, was any time she could spend time with her family, especially her grandchildren and great-grandchildren’s birthday parties.
