Sophia Lazurko Bishko, 94, formerly of Broadalbin, New York, died peacefully on Friday, April 7, 2017 in Houston, Texas, where she lived her last two-and-one-half years of life.

Sophia was born in Ukraine, to Rev. Petro Lazurko and his wife Maria. She immigrated to the United States in 1949 with her husband Konstantyn and their children as refugees. Her faith was a source of strength in meeting the challenges of building a new life on Union Mills Road, her home for 55 years. She was an active member of St. Basil's Ukrainian Catholic Church in Broadalbin and later St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Church in Amsterdam. Sophia was accomplished in traditional Ukrainian embroidery, was an excellent cook, and was well known for her generous hospitality.

Sophia was predeceased by her husband, Konstantyn, and sons Peter and Orest. She leaves behind daughters Christine (Victor) Villacorta of Houston, Texas and Irene (Rev. Roman) Galadza of Brampton, Ontario, Canada; son Igor (Carol) of Venice, Florida; widowed daughters-in-law, Sherry Bishko of Saratoga Springs, New York and Charlene Bishko of Little Rock, Arkansas; 12 grandchildren and 13 great grandchildren; nephews and nieces in Canada, Poland, and Ukraine.
