



## Walter G. "Gib" Gruet

January 15, 1943 - September 17, 2023

Walter G. "Gib" Gruet, 80, of Progress Road, Gloversville, went home to be with his Lord Sunday morning, September 17, 2023.

He was born at home in the Town of Northampton on January 15, 1943, a son of the late John and Florence Dane Gruet and was a 1961 graduate of Northville Central School. Following graduation, Gib served in the US Army, with two years of active duty and two years as a reservist. He was a lifelong area resident.

Mr. Gruet was employed at Niagara Mohawk Power Corp. in Gloversville for thirty-five years and retired in November 1999 as a service supervisor.

Gib was a dedicated member of the Baptist Church of Northville. Over the years, he served at Northville and Perth Bible Church as a deacon, trustee, Sunday school teacher, youth leader, and on mission committees. He started a deaf ministry at Perth Bible Church and interpreted for the deaf for more than forty years. He also taught many sign classes.

He enjoyed hunting with his boys, camping, and boating. Mostly, he loved spending time with family and friends.

Survivors include his wife, Linda Godey Gruet, whom he married on June 29, 1963; four sons, Thomas J. (Katrina) Gruet of Johnstown, Paul D.

(Jacqueline) Gruet of Goshen, IN, John M. (Racha) Gruet of Cedarville, OH, and Jeffrey S. (Amy) Gruet of Gloversville; a sister, Shirley Little of Ballston Lake; ten grandchildren, Chelsea (Brett), Caleb (Breana), Chase, Devin, Trey (Victoria), Brice, Ethan, Emma, Jocelynn, and Taylor; four great-grandchildren,
